TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

COST OF LIVING

Students should plan the following monthly expenses (approximate):

- Housing: starting by €200 (shared flat) or €240 (students' residence)
- Transport: Students' tickets (covers all public transport in the region during 6 months, Faculty 06 students can choose from two different regions), approx. €150
- Other expenses depending on individual life style.

ENROLMENT

Students will enroll by the second lecture week through the International Office Germersheim (specific information for each term will be sent directly to the incoming students).

Due to the geographical situation of the Germersheim Campus (approx. 100 km south of Mainz) it is not possible to attend courses at other faculties of Johannes Gutenberg University.

GRADING SYSTEM

Our grading system is based on a scale from 1,0 to 5,0. The minimum passing mark is 4,0.

1,0 to 1,3 – outstanding \mid 1,7 to 2,3 – good \mid 2,7 to 3,3 – regular \mid 3,7 to 4,0 – passed \mid 5,0 – suspense In some courses no marks, but "passed" or "suspense" and the respective ECTS credits are given.

VISA

Our institution will provide assistance, when required, in securing visas for incoming and outgoing students/staff, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.
